

Center 'Empathy' publishes conclusion on Mikheil Saakashvili's health condition, lawyers demand transfer abroad

The Center 'Empathy' has published the conclusion of the study regarding the health condition of ex-president Mikheil Saakashvili. Based on the statement, Saakashvili has more than 20 diagnoses or symptoms - about 10 of them make imprisonment incompatible.

According to the conclusion, Mikheil Saakashvili's current state of health is assessed as serious and incompatible with imprisonment - separate diagnoses, both separately and together, will lead to irreversible damage to Saakashvili's health, resulting in shortening of life expectancy and even death, if he is not given the opportunity to receive adequate diagnosis and treatment.

According to the statement, Mikheil Saakashvili currently has symptoms and diagnoses in terms of neuro-psychic, gastroenterological, locomotor system and vision. According to their reports, Saakashvili has a fever of unknown etiology, anorexia, rapid weight loss, pain in muscles, joints, and muscle spasms, "which may be the results of an unknown infectious



process and/or possible intoxication."

The lawyer of ex-president Mikheil Saakashvili, Shalva Khachapuridze, appealed to the court to fully release Saakashvili from his sentence or postpone it. "In the case, we have presented other evidence with which we will prove to the court that adequate treatment cannot and will not be provided to Saakashvili in Georgia. Accordingly, we submit a

motion for full release from his sentence, and as an alternative, a postponement of the imposed sentence.



'Exports to Georgia have almost doubled, we are sure that some of them go to Russia' Czech Ambassador Petr Mikyska says, Irakli Kobakhidze responds

n November 30, at an event organized by the non-governmental organization 'Free Russia' and the Embassy of Lithuania, the opposition politician Gigi Ugulava asked if "in the light of the fact that the Georgian government has betrayed its partners [by refusing to join the sanctions or taking into account other issues], whether the population of Georgia should expect any type of rejection Regarding the results." Ambassador Petr Mikyska stated: "Since the beginning of this year, the export of Czech products [from the Czech Republic] to Georgia has increased by 80%, compared to last year. almost doubled. Last year, despite the impact of the pandemic, we already had a record number,' he said, adding that "we are quite sure that part of exported products is going to Russia.' However, the idea that the increased amount of the product goes north is still unconfirmed and, according to Ambassador



Mikyska, there is not enough statistical data to confirm it.

As Netgazeti wrote, the Czech ambassador said at the meeting that "this will be one of the criteria when we evaluate Georgia's readiness for candidate status, not just 12 recommendations. Chairman of the Georgian Dream, Irakli Kobakhidze, responded to the mentioned statement of the Czech ambassador, Petr Mikiska. He said that if "the ambassador really said such a thing," it would be fol-lowed by a diplomatic response. "I don't know, it's the first time I hear this statement, but if this statement was made, it's really unbelievable. We've heard such statements from the Ukrainian authorities in the past, and then when we responded they had to deny it themselves. If this statement was made, we're going to respond. We will have the same reaction if this statement was made. Diplomatic, of course, what more should we do, a diplomatic response to the ambassador," said Kobakhidze.

"Firstly, as for the 'Empathy' Center itself, it is directly related to The National Movement, which its leader never hid. Therefore, the credibility is zero, this organization is biased as usual. Secondly, it should be mentioned what is such an illness that leads to the release of the prisoner, which other prisoners do not have. As for the list itself, any prisoner or nonprisoner can have such a list. That is, certain types of illnesses are experienced by practically everyone. Therefore, such a list does not mean anything by itself," said Kobakhidze.



Vocational education opens a pathway to success for people living in rural areas

Switzerland and UNDP announce a new phase of the project to support Vocational Education and Training in Georgia

BILISI. 1 December 2022 – Youth education, public-private partnerships, rural economy skills and modern technologies in Vocational Education and Training (VET) are the focus of a new project launched today by the Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation (SDC) and the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP). The threeyear initiative draws on US\$4.4 million in Swiss funding and will

be implemented in close partnership with the Ministry of Education and Science and the Ministry of Environmental Protection and Agriculture of Georgia.
