President Zourabichvili Fears Imposed Sanctions on Judges will Negatively Impact Georgia's Pending EU Candidacy Status

The President of Georgia Salome Zourabichvili responded to the US Department of State's decision imposing sanctions on four Georgian judges for being corrupt and harming Georgia's democracy, and said that she is not happy about it as she fears these sanctions will negatively impact Georgia's pending EU candidacy status and harm the country's image.

In her statement, Zourabichvili said that she fully supports the judicial reforms and acknowledges the negative impact four sanctioned judges had on Georgia's judicial system.

However, she thinks that the country does not deserve this issue becoming a reason for deepening polarization between internal forces and in relations with international partners, therefore she called on the authorities to fully investigate the case and work towards restoration of the country's reputation.

"This decision concerns only four persons and the visa restrictions of these four persons, as clarified by the Ambassador herself, the statement emphasizes the support of Georgia, despite this, the country's image is being somewhat damaged.

Georgia and the Georgian people are well aware of the responsibility of these people in forming a vicious judicial system. We all know and understand what should be done to improve the judicial system.

Our society knows very well what was not done and why it was not done. Therefore, we fully understand, share and support the need for judicial reform, as well



as the need to strengthen judicial independence and the need for professional and impartial personnel in the system, the 12 recommendations of the European Commission serve this and nothing else.

I am sorry that the country, with this decision, is included in the list of other sanctioned countries, while Georgia is waiting for the most important decision from its European partners - the granting of candidate status, and I am afraid that the US decision will be perceived as a negative signal in Europe.

Therefore, it is up to us to fix the image of the country, if we do not want to destroy the future of the country because of four people, effective steps are needed be it a full investigation or a review of the composition of the Supreme Council of Justice, or the timely selection of nonjudge members. The more effective steps are taken in terms of judicial reform, which all our loyal partners are watching and waiting for, the faster we will restore our country's reputation and trust in it.

The country really did not deserve this and does not deserve that this issue becomes a reason for deepening polarization. Neither between internal forces nor in relations with international friends.

A friendly country may have mercilessly told us what it had to say, but let's not be silent, let's not get angry, let's not be happy, but let's analyze what happened and why and what needs to be corrected. And let's show the world that we deserve another assessment and we will achieve our goal," said the president.

Irakli Kobakhidze Says Georgian Dream Has Asked for Evidence on Sanctioned Judges

The Chairman of Georgian Dream party, Irakli Kobakhidze spoke about US imposed sanctions on four judges and said that there was a request from the management team to clarify what evidence and sources the US decision was based on

According to Kobakhidze, because the Georgian government asked for evidence, the US Ambassador to Georgia Kelly Degnan had to 'back down' and say that it is a visa restriction and not a sanction.

Georgian Dream chair said that information obtained from open sources can not be used as a basis of sanctions:

"There were many meetings and at every meeting this question was asked, where is the evidence? Zero evidence - this became clear both in bilateral meetings and in public. Look at the TV interviews with the US Ambassador, there is zero evidence there either. It is not clear how it can be based on open source. Open

After all, this needs investigation and

research, it needs an investigation, which did not happen. Actually, there is no evidence and it has been revealed. It was because we asked for evidence that the ambassador had to back down and say that this is not a sanction, but a similar thing. This is a visa restriction, not a sanction. In fact, it was a drawback because we demanded evidence," Kobakhidze said.

When asked whether the government thinks that there is a possibility that it may be a decision based on wrong information, Irakli Kobakhidze said that Anony Blinken is obviously not to blame for this and the questions should probably be asked to the US Ambassador Kelly

Degnan and the US Embassy.

"Now, Blinken is not guilty, is it not clear? Blinken, of course, cannot delve into the ongoing processes in Georgia, he has much more to do. Blinken is not the person to ask questions. Perhaps we should ask the Ambassador who is here, we should ask the embassy," said Kobakhidze.


