President Zourabichvili Broadcasts Video Address on 1,000 Days Since the Russian Invasion of Ukraine

On November 19, Georgian President Salome Zourabichvili broadcasted a video address marking the 1,000th day since Russia's invasion of Ukraine. In her address, she celebrated Ukraine's unwavering resistance and highlighted its broader significance in defending European freedom.

"For 1,000 days, you, Ukrainian friends, have been fighting to defend your country, your independence, and your freedom," Zourabichvili said. She emphasized that Ukraine's fight goes beyond its own borders, representing a broader struggle for all European nations standing against Russian imperialism and territorial expansion. "And you are waging this fight on behalf of us, on behalf of everyone, and on behalf of all Europeans who want to defend freedom against Russian imperialism and Russia's desire to annex the territory of its neighbors."

Zourabichvili expressed solidarity with Ukraine and reiterated that their struggle would never be forgotten. "This struggle of yours, dear Ukrainian friends, will never be forgotten,"



she added.

The president also made a pointed connection between Ukraine's resistance and Georgia's own ongoing challenges with Russia.

Zourabichvili referenced protests in occupied Abkhazia, where Georgian citizens are opposing Russia's attempts to further annex the region. "And it may be a coincidence, but certainly not,

that today, in occupied Abkhazia, our citizens are opposing another attempt by Russia to annex Abkhazia," she said.

The President expressed confidence that Russia's efforts in

both Ukraine and Georgia would fail, emphasizing that "wherever people fight for freedom and independence, they will win everywhere."

122nd IPRM Meeting Focuses on Detentions and Borderization

On November 19, the 122nd Incident Prevention and Response Mechanism (IPRM) meeting was held near Ergneti, close to the Tskhinvali occupation line. Key discussions revolved around the illegal detention of Georgian citizens by Tskhinvali's occupying forces and ongoing "borderization" activities.

Irakli Antadze, deputy director of the analytical department of Georgia's State Security Service, highlighted the continued efforts to secure the release of nine Georgian citizens currently detained. "Active work is ongoing with support from international partners to ensure their return," he stated.

The meeting also addressed the "borderization" process, where occupying forces erect physical barriers along the occupation line. Antadze reiterated the Georgian government's stance that these actions disrupt freedom of movement and provoke severe incidents, urging an end to such activities.

Another key issue was the restricted operation of crossing points along the occupation line. The Georgian government criticized the current allowance of ten operational days per month as inadequate and called for daily crossings to better serve the local population.

The unresolved case of Tamaz Ginturi, a Georgian citizen allegedly murdered by occupying forces, was also raised. Antadze emphasized that justice for Ginturi and other victims remains a priority for the central government.

The next IPRM meeting is scheduled for early February 2025, continuing the dialogue on these pressing

Abkhazia's De Facto President Resigns Amid Ongoing Protests and Russian Pressure



The parliament of occupied Abkhazia voted to accept the resignation of defacto president Aslan Bzhania, following protests sparked by the controversial "Investment Agreement with Russia." The decision came after several days of unrest, which began on November 15, when demonstrators stormed the so-called parliament and presidential buildings in opposition to plans to ratify the agreement that would allow Russian ownership of land and property in the region.

In the vote, 31 "deputies" participated, with two ballots declared invalid. De facto Vice President Badra Gunba will assume the role of acting "president", while former "speaker" Valeri Bganba was appointed as the de facto prime minister.

According to a statement released by the press service of the defacto president, Bzhania's resignation was made to preserve stability and uphold constitutional order in the region. His resignation comes after growing discontent among the population, particularly over Abkhazia's closer ties with Russia, which included a decision by Moscow to cut funding to the region in September.



EXTERNAL MERCHANDISE TRADE OF GEORGIA IN JANUARY-OCTOBER 2024 (PRELIMINARY)

In January-October 2024 the external merchandise trade (excluding non-declared trade) of Georgia amounted to USD 19 025.3 million, 5.5 percent higher year-on-year. The exports equaled 5 468.4 million (7.4 percent higher), while the imports stood at USD 13 556.9 million (4.8 percent higher). The negative trade balance was USD 8 088.5 million in January-October 2024 and its share in external trade turnover constituted 42.5 percent.

The three multilateral development banks will each provide US\$ 160 million, supporting the construction of two solar power
